This authorization is valid for 30 days, the Researcher may seek your consent and reauthorization to extend further.

- Since your Study Specific Instagram Data is a “copy” of certain data points from your Instagram account, sharing your Study Specific Instagram will not impact your Instagram experience and your Instagram data will continue to be subject to Meta’s [Privacy Policy](#).
- If there are any issues that prevent Meta from sharing the Study Specific Instagram Data, the Researcher will be informed. For example, if there are technical difficulties or there is a consent withdrawal.

Data Shared by the Researcher with Meta

Researcher Data includes:

 - Confirmation that the Researcher received this consent.
 - Timestamps of when the Researcher received this consent.
